International Trade in Alfalfa

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International trade for alfalfa hay and other products show revealing patterns in recent years


- 1. Domestic cost of production and supplies affect price base and variations in competiveness.
- 2. Exporters are those places that produce hay competively and use less than they produce. In Europe and western US lots of hay production and use, but still some excess for export.
- 3. The major exporters and importers have been relatively stable in recent years.
- 4. Unit prices also not as volatile as prices for grains and oilseeds.



January to YTD 2022




Index of Exchange Rates of US\$ Dollar to Select Foreign Currencies November 2007-October 2022





Volume of Annual Forage Product Exports by Top Exporting Countries, 2017-2021



Value of Annual Forage Product Exports by Top Exporting Countries, 2017-2021




Average Unit Values of Annual Hay Exports by Top Exporting Countries, 2017-2021

Annual US Alfalfa Export Volumes by Top Destinations, 2002-2022YTD



Final Remarks

- 1. Global alfalfa trade continued to grow in past 5 years.
- 2. The USA continued to be the largest exporter followed by the EU and Australia.
- 3. Big importers are Japan, China, UAE, Korea and Saudi Arabia, places that produce milk, meat and other livestock but with little space or water for forage.
- 4. Currency exchange rates an expensive US\$ has been a drag on hay trade in 2022, but that also affects milk, oilseed and grain trade too.
